Hello Sailors,

The wind was so light initially that none of the competitors were at the line at 12, but the RC committee kept an eye out for a change and a 4-6 mph wind northnorthwest came in spurts. In a timely manner they got the first one lap race off with 8 boats on the line. The wind was light and inconsistent, but Darin O on his Sun Fish made the most of what was available. Hello Sailors,

Their performance shows how excellent our club is. The horns, the flags, the call backs, the time tabulations, were all completed on a professional level. The wind was steady at SSW building from 11 to 14 knots by the last race. There was an occasional gust making it interesting. The chop grew with each race and the tide was going out. We had 9 boats on the line with 5 designs represented.

In one of the races they were nudged at the start line and there was a conversation about rights when the leeward boat is going up on the windward boat. This situation will be discussed as a fleet since this is a common happening and we can all learn from these examples. Remember to call a protest immediately if you feel you have been fouled. There was one boat over early in the first race that did not come back to cross the start line.

In the first leeward leg of one of the races Curt R made a great move to roll Jim K at the leeward mark and took the inside overlap. He left Salty Sailor admiring his stern. Darin O showed his athleticism sailing the Sun Fish in these winds. We had 2 Day Sailors with Mike M and Curt R out there setting up another in-design competition. Ray M showed us how fast that Hobie Wave can go with a nice breeze. Andre' C had help this race from Amber S, and Anthony S jumped on board with Curt R. Mark B and Chris did a great job without much ballast. Jim K has found an able seaman in Todd R on Salty Sailor. It is nice to see Erik E and Brian C out on the water with us again.

Congrats to all the sailors for racing in challenging conditions with no capsizes. This was a great day to work on spinnaker skills. Just a great day overall.

Hello Sailors,

What a challenging day on the water. The wind was highly variable in speed and direction. It varied from 3 to 10 knots, but some gusts were even more. The wind was mostly from the east but would oscillate frequently. The tide was going out and the chop was minimal. Our RC was Marc and Luiza Holtzberg and Sohil Adwani, and they had a tough day at the office. They set up a 0.3 nm course and ran 2 lap, 1 lap, and finally a 2 lap race perfectly. In the first race the windward mark lost its anchor and followed the boats to the finish line. The RC had to go in to harbor to get a new anchor. They expeditiously got the races restarted and got two more races in.

There were 3 Mutineers, a Lightning, and a Day Sailor. The first two races saw intense competition with 4 boats finishing within 16 seconds of each other, and the second race 3 boats within 15 seconds of each other. Kudos to RC for getting accurate times for these close finishes. Don M had Darin O on board this being the maiden voyage for his Day Sailor and they showed they can be fast. Herb M had Jaden A on board, and Dan H had Adina H. Jim K had Todd R on his Mutt. These 3 boats were neck and neck frequently with good tactical situations arising. The sailing was top notch. Karissa H and Joe B got the Lightning performing well the first race, and then chose to practise during the last 2 races. The third race had patchy variable winds that allowed Salty Sailor to find better air on the right side of the course and had a great finish. Todd R demonstrated skill with the multiple gybes that were needed.

Salty Sailor got to the harbor first and caught a gust that buried the mast in the mud. So once RC came and got them upright and towed them in, they were last to the dock.

There is a concern regarding who is skippering the boat and if the boat is following class rules. These will be addressed by Herb M and the expectations will be clearly delineated for the next series. These races were scored following the pattern of the previous races in this series.
